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The following items are identified, needing attention or highlighted during school walkthrough:

- **Home Ec Room:** There is no working dishwasher which raises food safety concerns by SCC. The current hot water system does not keep up to current demands.
- Art Room: The Art Room can accept art supply donations.
- **Gym:** New sound system just installed in gym. The Canadian Flags are moving to the stage wall as recommended by our Legion members.
- Bathrooms: KCI bathroom conditions need to attention as soon possible. Bathrooms have broken toilets, ceiling / countertop tiles broken, stall doors broken, or doors completely missing all together.
- Tuck Shop / Breakfast Program & Free Lunch Program area:
 - Kudos to all the work done by Mrs. Tetoff getting the grant for the Breakfast program. Tight space limits opportunities to expand program options. No sink in Tuck shop.
 - No Student Micowaves as electric capacity would only serve 4 microwaves throughout the school. The student lineups would be too great. Wish list.

The teachers worked with their students to leave ideas and suggestions for SCC. They include:

- **New Outdoor equipment:** such as outdoor trampoline, outdoor skating/hockey rink**, new swing set, volleyball/badminton court**, football field on jr. end, better outdoor equipment, tennis court, hot tub, treehouse, snow hill and sleds, curling rink/crocanole board, gazebo, gardens, adult size playground equipment for big kids, rock wall
- Indoor ideas: vending machines that work, snack vending maching, better water pressure for water fountains, new gym equipment including double rimmed basketball hoops, fidgets attached to the walls in the hallway, loft in library, a sick room
- **Cultural ideas:** include a tipi on the jr. end of school.
- Activities: beading group, gaming club, class pets, open Tuck shop more
- Other: field trip sponsorship, more field trips, mice for our chrombooks (corded not wireless)

Students also noted things they love about KCI and include: sports, rallies, vending maching, different teachers that teach stuff, gym class, business ed lab, lockers, free lunch program, variety of books in the library, free hot dogs & hot lunch, chromebooks, 2 gyms, having free time, long lunch/recess, playing instruments, the water fountain, staff members, cultural room, art activities, bigger lockers & locker rooms
